



LaSalle Street Tutoring Program

LaSalle Street is a tutoring program and/or mandatory academic intervention designed to assist students in their academics. LaSalle Street classes are every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday after school starting at 4:05 pm and ending at 5:05 pm and on Friday's from 2pm to 4pm. Students will be able to receive tutoring from teachers and qualified students during this time.

How is a student placed in this program?

A student can be assigned mandatory LaSalle Street classes by not meeting required academic criteria. Students are required to stay after for the entire one-hour class even if assignments are completed before the class ends.

- 1) A student will be assigned a LaSalle Street class if they do not turn in their homework the day it is due. The LaSalle Street class will be assigned the day the assignment is due and must be attended by that student otherwise a detention will be issued. **THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS.** If a student does not complete the school day due to an early dismissal the student must serve the LaSalle the next day.
- 2) Students who accumulate failing grades in academic classes at the time progress reports are issued will be placed in the Level 1 Academic Intervention Program. This intervention program requires the student to attend specific teacher office hours until the F's have been brought up to a passing grade. Failure to serve a LaSalle while in the Level 1 Academic Intervention Program will result in a detention being issued.
- 3) Students who are in good academic standing and are not recommended by a teacher may optionally choose to attend LaSalle Street classes. Students are encouraged to attend LaSalle Street classes for any concerns they may be having with their academics. Students who attend a LaSalle Street class on their own are not required to stay the full hour.

STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO BRING ONLY ACADEMIC MATERIALS TO LASALLE STREET CLASSES. DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR SUCH AS SLEEPING, TALKING OR USING NON-ACADEMIC MATERIALS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED. STUDENTS WHO ARE DISRUPTIVE WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE AND ISSUED A DETENTION.
