



Academic Intervention Program

Throughout the school year, students' grades will be monitored to recognize those students who excel and to also identify those students who may need additional academic assistance. To ensure that the school, student, and student's family are aware and actively addressing any potential academic concerns, Speer Academy will assign students struggling with grades to the Academic Intervention Program (AIP). This program will provide the students with resources that are designed to address academic weaknesses.

AIP for any Student with an "F"

Students who accumulate one or more failing grades (F's) in academic classes on a two-week progress report will be required to attend office hours for each class they have an F in for two weeks. For every F received, the student must go to that specific teacher's office hours once a week for the next two weeks. Office hours are one hour long (till 5:05pm Mon-Thurs). Students will be marked absent if they do not stay for the entire hour. Office hours will be on Monday through Thursday from 4:05pm to 5:05pm. There will be no office hours on Fridays. Students will be issued 2 demerits for every office hour they miss. Students will be assigned to AIP every two weeks when progress reports are issued. Students will be given notification from the Assistant Principal.

Example – John Smith receives his progress report and has an F in Algebra I and an F in Biology. John must go to office hours once a week for the next two weeks for each F. John must go to his Biology teacher's office hours on Tuesday from 4:05pm to 5:05pm the next two weeks. John must also go to his Algebra I teacher's office hours on Thursdays from 4:05pm to 5:05pm the next two weeks.

AIP for any Student with a GPA below 2.0

Students placed on academic probation due to a current grade point average (GPA) below a C average (2.0). Students with GPA's below a 2.0 will be required to attend two academic labs each week for the two-week period. Parents will be notified once the student is assigned to the program. Potential meetings with the Assistant Principal, advisor, school social worker and teacher(s) may be required. The student will meet with the Assistant Principal and all grades will be verified before the student can be dismissed from this program.

ANY STUDENT IN THE ACADEMIC INTERVENTION PROGRAM WHO DOES NOT ATTEND AN ACADEMIC LAB WILL BE ISSUED 2 DEMERITS FOR EVERY LAB THEY MISS. FAILURE TO COMPLETE ANY OF THE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS MAY JEAPORDIZE A STUDENTS PROMOTION TO THE NEXT GRADE LEVEL
